Supplemental information concerning HUB goals:

The Agency is currently exceeding its goals in three areas and falling short in three areas. The shortfall with "Heavy Construction" will continue as no projects are currently underway. The expenses related to the two remaining construction areas will adjust as we proceed through the fiscal year and additional projects come on line.

Supplemental comments concerning the level of effort in support of the HUB operations at TTUHSC:

In addition to the level of effort and cost demonstrated in sections 5, 7 and 8 of this report. TTUHSC also allocates/commits additional staff, resources and time to the support of the HUB activities and reporting as noted below.

- 1. Purchasing Office: Purchasing staff, made up of Purchaser's and Supervisors (7 FTE's) is dedicated to and works on a daily basis to support the HUB activities of the Institution.
- 2. VendorTeam: Two staff members that work on a daily basis to ensure our vendor database correctly reflects the HUB status of each vendor.
- 3. Finance: One analyst who dedicates 10% of her time to HUB office. One Senior Administrator has spent 10% of their time during FYQ1 in oversight to ensure we are meeting the new reporting reuirements.
- 4. Finance Reporting: One report writer has spent 25% of their time in FYQ1 to HUB reporting.
- 5. Finance System Management: In support of the Texas Connection Consortiums effort to update Banner to accommodate the reporting information required for this report has spent to this

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date a combined 90 hours beta testing the functionality.		
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
